

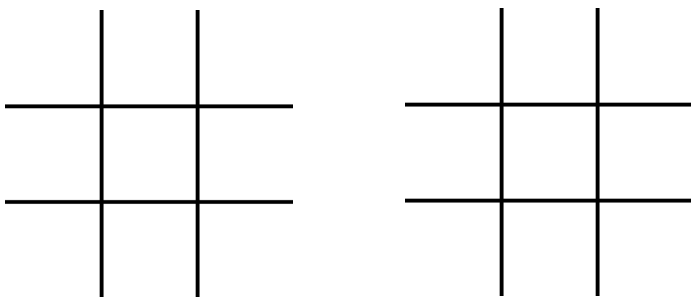

Junior Cheeseburger

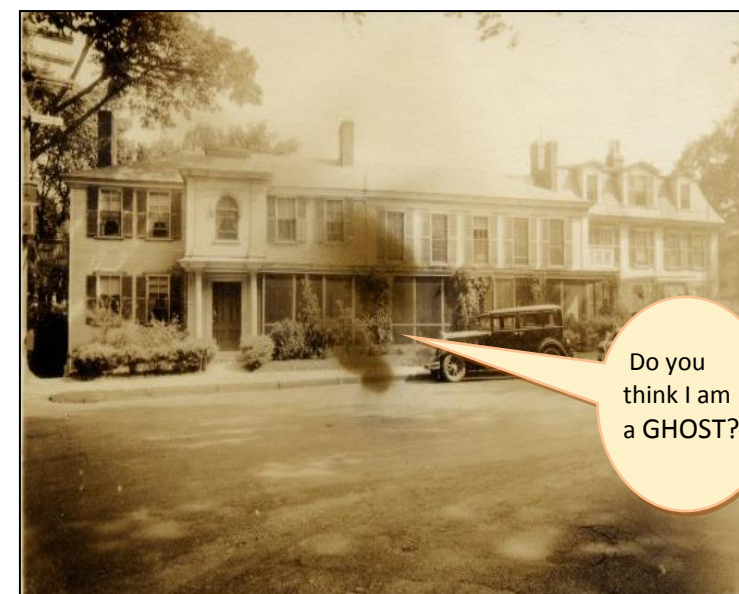
4oz. beef burger with American cheese and French fries

Do you know about Concord's Colonial Inn??

- ❖ The original structure was built in 1716, and the property has been operated as a hotel since 1889
- ❖ In 1775, the Minutemen kept their arms and provisions in one of the Inn's original buildings. These supplies helped the Minutemen defeat the British in the first battle of the American Revolution that occurred at the North Bridge on April 19th
- ❖ Henry David Thoreau resided from 1835 to 1837 while he attended Harvard.
- ❖ Franklin Roosevelt (FDR) stayed the evening of 25 May 1904.
- ❖ Some believe the Inn is haunted with the ghost of an angry Native American woman of the Assabet tribe who sold the six-square-mile area of land that constituted early Concord to colonists.
- ❖ Some believe the ghost of Ralph Waldo Emerson, father of American transcendentalism, has been haunting the Inn since the noted author and philosopher's great-great grandfather owned the original plot of land where the Inn now stands.
